- Key audience: educators, psychologists, families.



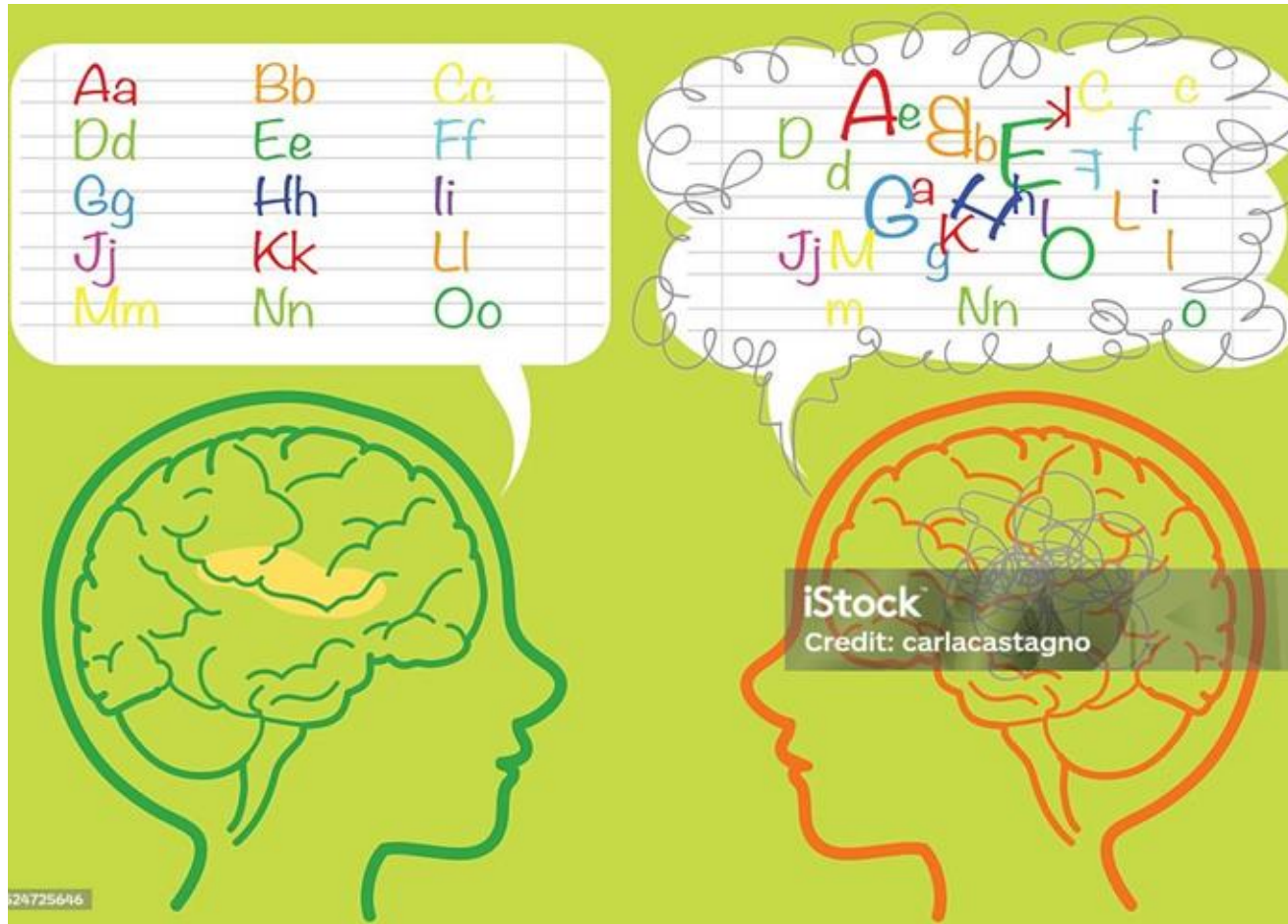
2. What is Giftedness?

- Advanced cognitive skills, creativity, problem-solving.
- Intellectual and creative abilities beyond average
- Traits: curiosity, advanced reasoning, motivation. Includes emotional and artistic talents, not just academic success.
- Measured via IQ, creativity tests, observations, achievements.



3. Twice-Exceptional Learners, Coexistence of Dyslexia and Giftedness

- Dyslexia and giftedness can coexist, forming a unique profile: gifted + dyslexia = 2e profile
- Uneven skills: strong reasoning + weak literacy
- Emotional aspects: stress, anxiety, low confidence
- Both challenges and strengths require tailored support



4. Challenges Faced

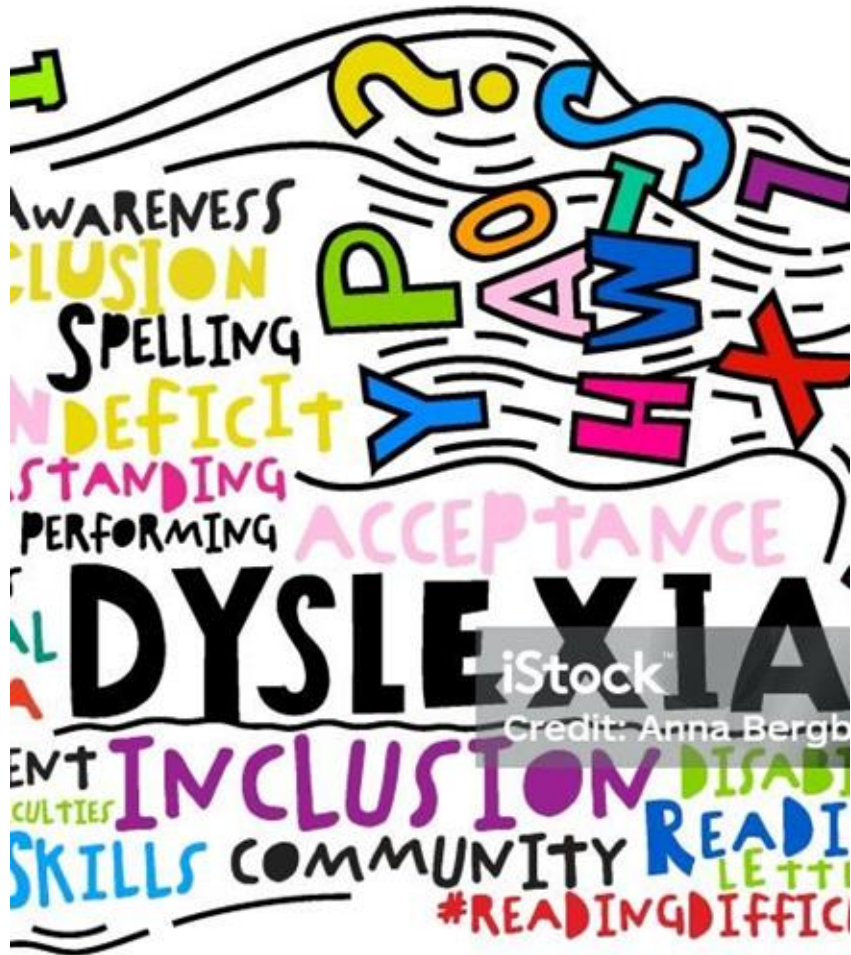
- Academic struggles & underachievement

- Anxiety, low self-esteem and motivational issues due to misdiagnosis or lack of understanding
- Misdiagnosis and overlooked potential
- Underachievement despite high potential

- Neuropsychological assessment

- Strength-based approaches instead of rote learning
